Avoiding Medical Errors by Better Diagnosing Pain and Addiction

Course Description

According to the National Institute on Drug and Abuse, "Every day, more than 130 people in the US die after overdosing on opioids. The CDC estimates that the total "economic burden" of prescription opioid misuse alone in the US, is \$78.5 BILLION PER YEAR." Yet headlines from the NY Times disclose, "Purdue Pharma Payments to Sackler Family Soared Amid Opioid Crisis". Many of us wonder, why is the death rate continuing to climb after such media exposure about opioids.

Practitioners are beginning to realize everyone is familiar with the word "opioid", however the names of the actual medications that are still being prescribed for pain, many are unfamiliar with. Also, many practitioners are uncomfortable in having the conversation about opioid addiction to those who are currently under medication, creating an opportunity for negligence. This course has been designed to eliminate practice errors for chiropractors through improving diagnostic procedures, coding, history and proper patient education in relation for different pain and addiction issues. Also, this lecture will address different models of care for pain, so proper resources can be created.
